Kizner, who started with jazz and tap at age 7, expanded to contemporary and Afro-Caribbean styles. In 2018, they were the first recipients of the B. Wilson Producing Scholars Grant. June 2019 marked their first showcase performed at the Kraine theater, which birthed SteLi Productions, LLC. Since establishment, they have
