

say I Love You is the second half of HOMEless that reflects on the cyclical emotional and sexual trauma queer youth experience and the realization of self-worth and self-love. With say I Love You, we entrust ourselves with a new power navigating romance, sexual temptation – desires, wants and curiosities, and the continual lust for love. While also embracing the past, living in the present, and being open to the future.
