

"Tempest in a Teacup"

Tempest in a Teacup is a 25-minute dance-theater piece. Through humor, sincerity, dance-routines, distractions, and fragmented dialogues, six distinct characters bring some of life's existential anxieties to the stage. As this non-linear and abstract world unfolds, the performers grapple with their own unique temperaments and worries, telling stories and helping one another through « risky » physical situations. The performers depict scenes that reference reality, but that challenge its significance and that ask what, if anything, is worth being afraid of.
