

Founded in 1986, Dixon Place (DP) is a non-profit institution deeply committed to fostering visionary artists by developing and presenting original work in the performing and literary arts. Organically developed programs, policies and curatorial practices ensure inclusivity regarding gender, race, sexual orientation, disabilities, age, and ethnicity. In a professional, compassionate, safe environment where artist remuneration is a priority, this local bastion inspires and encourages creators to generate new ideas and implement new practices.

Studied at Danzahoy-Escuela, Venezuela and later joined the professional company, DANZAHOY. In 1998 founded Rastro, in NYC. Has received the Astral Career grant, D'jerassi Artist Residency Program in California, which distinguished her with the Bessie Schönberg Memorial Endowed Fellowship, and an Artward Bound artist in residency at White Oak Plantation with The Field, among other residencies. Her choreography has been presented at Joyce SoHo, CPR - Brooklyn, Dumbo Dance Festival, dancenow, to name a few and internationally in Mexico, Venezuela, Belize, Colombia, Brazil, England, Canada and Germany. In 2016, Julieta was a guest artist at the DanzaExtrema Festival Internacional, Veracruz MX, where she received recognition for her artistic trajectory, and came back (to Xalapa, Mexico) in 2018 to perform "Venezuela". In 2017, she was the first artist in residency at Triskelion Arts, Brooklyn.

Valero has been part of the Queen Dance Festival 3 times in the last 6 years. More recently, 2022, she was invited to perform one of her newest choreography: Remedy, at the Harlem Creative Movement Festival, and was the choreographer for the Arepa Coalition Project, this past August of 2023 at El Barrio Art Space PS109. Julieta presented her work at Theater For The New City in 2016 with a small festival, and it was recently part of "The Miracle" an immersive theater experience written and directed by Alberto Ferreras. She is honored to be part of the Fast Forward Dance Series for the second time.

### The Sky Is Green & The Grass is Blue

Contemporary piece based on the concept of Willful Ignorance and Difficult Knowledge. Willful Ignorance, is often used in psychology as well as criminal law to address those who lack the information or facts because they refuse to acknowledge them. It's useful and safe to avoid resolving an issue by convincing oneself about their existence. A contemporary technical and athletic piece that explores soft, peaceful and organic movements, against and in conjunction, with fast and sharper ones, showcasing the contradiction in one's mind.

Our choreography has been featured in NYC SummerStage, Battery Dance Festival, Carnival Choreographers Ball, Webster Hall, Dixon Place, Fuse TV, TinyDanz (Birmingham, AL), MAD Dance (Rochester NY), NYC Half Marathon, The NY Jazz Choreography Project, The Baltimore Invitational; as well as several films, music videos, commercials and industrials. We have been awarded choreographic commissions, grants and our pieces have made the YAGP NYC finals on several occasions.
